ABOUT WORLD BIODIVERSITY DAY:

May 22 is observed as World Biodiversity Day every year by United Nations. The International Day for Biological Diversity falls within the scope of the UN Post-2015 Development Agenda's Sustainable Development Goals. In this larger initiative of international cooperation, the topic of biodiversity concerns stakeholders in sustainable agriculture; desertification, land degradation and drought; water and sanitation; health and sustainable development; energy; science, technology and innovation, knowledge-sharing and capacity-building; urban resilience and adaptation; sustainable transport; climate change and disaster risk reduction; oceans and seas; forests; vulnerable groups including indigenous peoples; and food security.

Biodiversity is a mix of living organisms dwelling on Earth. The earth's biomes which include the Forests, Tundra, Aquatic, Grassland and desserts collectively churn the ecosystem. Biodiversity also refers to the number, or abundance of different species living within a particular region. In biodiversity, each species, no matter how big or small has an important role to play in ecosystem. It represents the wealth of biological resources available to us. It's all about the sustaining the natural area made up of community of plants, animals, and other living things that is begin reduced at a steady rate as we plan human activities that is being reduced by habitat destruction.
